POPULATION BASED CANCER REGISTRY, AURANGABAD Indian Cancer Society

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After a hands-on experience of the Mumbai and Poona Cancer Registry, Indian Cancer Society established the Aurangabad Cancer Registry in 1978 with an aim to estimate magnitude of cancer for the entire Aurangabad state agglomeration. Aurangabad state agglomeration comprises the Aurangabad city and the cantonment area.

Registration of cancer cases is done by the active method wherein the social workers visit the hospitals, nursing homes, hospices, in government and private sector to collect data on cancer incidence. Mortality or the death statistics are collected from the vital statistics department of the Aurangabad Municipal Corporation.

The data are cross-checked to ensure complete coverage so as to maintain authenticity of the data obtained. Efforts are made by the registry to ensure that the data obtained are correct and as complete as possible. Different identifiers are used to check the reliability of the data. Thorough data cleaning is carried out to check for errors and duplication of entries.

The reliability of data and quality of registration have considerably improved since the use of PBCR centralized software for data compilation. For the years 2012-2014, a total of 2241 cases were registered. The percentage of cases diagnosed microscopically in these 3 years accounted for 93.7% of the total while the diagnosis through death certificates only contributed 5% of cases and the cases diagnosed clinically remained 1.3%.
